Beginner / Recreational: Learn to Play Intermediate (B) Intermediate Plus (B+) Upper-Intermediate (BB) Advanced Upper-Intermediate (BB+) Competitive / Pro (A and AA)

Beginner / Recreational: Learn to Play

General Rules: Knows the basic rules of volleyball but may not understand more technical aspects.

Positions & Rotation: May or may not be familiar with basic positions and rotation.

Serving: Can serve the ball over the net and keep it in play about 50% of the time.

Passing: Tries to pass to teammates most of the time but occasionally just hits the ball back over the net.

Ball Placement: Focuses on keeping the ball in bounds rather than placing it strategically.

Scoring: May not fully understand how to score points, keep track of the score, or announce it.

Blocking: May not know what blocking is or see much of it at this level.

Net Rules: Knows not to touch the net and understands when to call for the ball to avoid collisions.

Additional Notes:

Many sets are considered carries.

Hitters often don't use a true approach.

Points are frequently awarded due to execution errors like shanks and poor passes.

Intermediate (B)

Rules Understanding: Has a thorough understanding of the rules.

Passing: Can pass at Level 1: Most passes reach the setter, allowing them to set a hitter.

Game Play: Enjoys playing games with set positions for the setter and opportunities for everyone to set.

Momentum Control: Lands safely on their side of the court after hitting.

Blocking: Typically attempts to block when a hitter is in front.

Skills: Capable of passing, setting, and hitting proficiently.

Serving: Gets about 75% of serves in play.

Sportsmanship: Displays good sportsmanship and encourages others.

Additional Notes:

Teams regularly attempt to make three hits per side.

Setters are usually in the middle front position.

Players rotate through positions rather than having fixed roles.

A solid "B" player is consistent; skill often outweighs height. Many "B" level hitters do not use a standard hitting approach. Most points are earned rather

than given away due to execution errors.

Intermediate Plus (B+)

Assessment: Requires evaluation by a senior member. Suitable for players who have met all Intermediate level requirements and some Upper-Intermediate requirements.

Returning Players: Ideal for those returning from a higher level or a long break.

Upper-Intermediate (BB)

Technical Rules: Knows all the technical rules of the game.

Sets & Serving: Can serve to specific zones consistently and understands different types of sets for each hitter.

Offense Understanding: Fully understands how to run a 5-1 and 6-2 offense.

Skills: Proficient at blocking, setting, passing, and hitting. Knows how to cover the court defensively during a serve and a hit.

Serving Accuracy: Gets 90% or more of serves in play.

Coverage: Knows how to cover a hitter and can direct free balls into difficult areas for opponents.

Additional Notes:

Front-row hitters can take an approach and hit the ball consistently.

Teams have defined positions: outside hitter, middle hitter, right-side hitter, setter, and defensive specialist.

Setters can set outside, middle, and right-side balls with minimal spin.

Upper-Intermediate players are very skilled but not as consistent as BB+ or A-level players. Shorter players can compete with strong skills.

Advanced Upper-Intermediate (BB+)

Requirements: Meets or exceeds all BB level requirements.

Techniques: Able to hit with different techniques from the same position.

Passing: Passes at Level 3: Passes reach the setter, allowing them to set all three hitters.

Awareness: Knows how to spot a double or lift and is aware when it happens.

Additional Information:

Superb players, highly athletic.

Uses complex offenses indoors.

Passing is exceptional.

Setters understand and run tempo sets and various offenses.

Performs all skills consistently at a high level: blocking, setting, passing, and hitting.

Knows 5-1, 6-2, and 4-2 offenses and how to cover the court defensively.

Competitive / Pro (A and AA)

Eligibility: Reserved for the highest-level players, typically professionals or those with extensive playing experience throughout their volleyball careers.
